



Range and Safety Rules

**Any Exceptions to These Rules Must Be Approved
by the NBRG Executive Board**

1. General Membership Range Shooting 9:00am-Dusk /or 8:00pmEST (Whichever Comes First).
Exception is Club Sponsored Events.
2. All shooters and spectators shall wear eye and ear protection.
3. STOP shooting when train is passing.
4. Use proper targets. Empty cans, glass bottles, ammunition boxes, shotgun hulls etc. are not permitted.
5. Members must sign in and out and wear your door card/ ID badge in a visible manner upon your person while at NBRG.
6. Do not shoot at trees, buildings or anything other than designated target panels.
7. Pick up your trash and dispose of in proper trash containers.
8. Take down old targets and discard in proper trash containers.
9. No tracer, incendiary or explosive cartridges or devises are allowed.
10. Be considerate of other club members in your choice of range. Various activities can be conducted simultaneously. Don't tie up the 100 yard rifle range shooting handguns if a hand gun range is open.
11. Use of full automatic weapons are restricted to those that are licensed and legal in all respects
12. Scheduled club events have priority over all other activities.
13. Use common sense, good sportsmanship and recognized range safety procedures at all times. Always keep loaded weapons pointed downrange.
14. No loading or unloading of any weapons in the clubhouse.
15. Use of the club and facilities is reserved for current club members and their guests.
16. All empty cases are to be picked up with exception of .22 rimfire.
17. Put shooting benches back under the shelter.
18. Participants or spectators will consume NO ALCOHOL while shooting event is being held.
19. Put discarded live ammo in dud poles.
20. Member's card covers family (spouse and children) when accompanied by member.

21. Members are limited to 2 guests at a time. Member must be present. Guests should be limited to not over 3 visits per year. It's time to apply for membership.
22. Access to club buildings is limited to members having a need or reason for same. Executive board shall make all such determinations.
23. Any member found to be in non-compliance with club rules will be expelled. Anyone unable or unwilling to observe club rules should terminate voluntarily.
24. Treat all guns as loaded.
25. Keep action open. Never load your gun until you are in position and ready to shoot.
26. Keep your finger off the trigger until you are ready to shoot.
27. Be sure of your target before shooting. Know what is behind or beyond the target.
28. Never point a gun at anything that you do not intend to shoot.
29. Do not bring loaded guns into clubhouse. Exception would be a Michigan recognized concealed carry license.
30. Be sure your guns are safe to operate with no obstructions in the barrel and that your ammunition is appropriate for the caliber or gauge.
31. Never shoot while under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
32. If you have a hang fire, misfire or dud, stop and take appropriate action.
33. Always obey any command to "Cease Fire".
34. Never shoot when anyone is downrange from you.
35. Never shoot up into the air.
36. Never shoot at archery targets with a gun.
37. Before using the 200 yard rifle range, make sure the trap ranges are not in use.
38. Before using the trap range, make sure the 200 yard rifle range is not in use.
39. Rolling targets are prohibited. Portable Targets must be placed at base of backstop.
40. If the cap of a muzzleloader fires but the powder does not ignite, wait a few minutes, then reseat the projectile before putting in a new cap and try again.
41. If you have any doubt about how or if to do something, ASK!
42. While participating in an organized shoot, Match Director(s) shall settle disputes.
43. If a range that you want to use is already in use, use another range, or ask the first shooter(s) if you can shoot with them, at the same distance.
44. Do not stand too close to steel plates when shooting handguns. Rebounds go far.
45. No shooting allowed during club meetings.
46. All club sponsored events are open to the public.
47. **Any changes to Range and Safety rules will be brought before the membership at (2) meetings with a vote at the second meeting of members in attendance.**
